



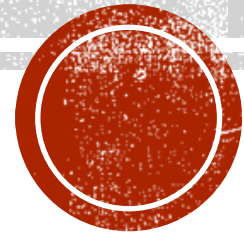

CONTESTING IS

- A competition, with a set of objectives, rules, and a system of scoring, resulting in a ranking of entrants
- A marathon, in most cases, a contest occurs over many hours or days
- An exercise that builds radio operating skills
- A way to make many contacts across various bands and geographical entities



ARRL NOVEMBER SWEEPSTAKES

Objective: To support amateur self-training in radiocommunications, including improving amateur operating skills, conducting technical investigations, and intercommunicating with other amateurs. Stations in the United States and Canada (including territories and possessions) exchange information with as many other US and Canadian stations as possible on the 160, 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10 meter bands.



IARU HF WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP

Objective: To support amateur self-training in radiocommunications including improving amateur operating skills, conducting technical investigations, and intercommunicating with other amateurs around the world, especially IARU member society headquarters stations, using the 160, 80, 40, 20, 15 and 10-meter bands.



CQ WORLD WIDE DX CONTEST

The CQ World Wide DX Contest (CQWW) offers 48 hours of nonstop DX-chasing fun with activity taking place from virtually every part of the world! Whether you are competing for awards, looking for a few new band-countries, or simply filling up your logbook, the CQWW offers something for everyone.

- Inspect equipment
- Replace / upgrade equipment
- Implement improvements in your process
- Review your own performance or have it critiqued by a group



PARTICIPATE

- Set aside time to compete
- Commit to complete an entire contest
- Get active with a contesting group

- Hunt and pounce
- Running a frequency
- Sprint-mode

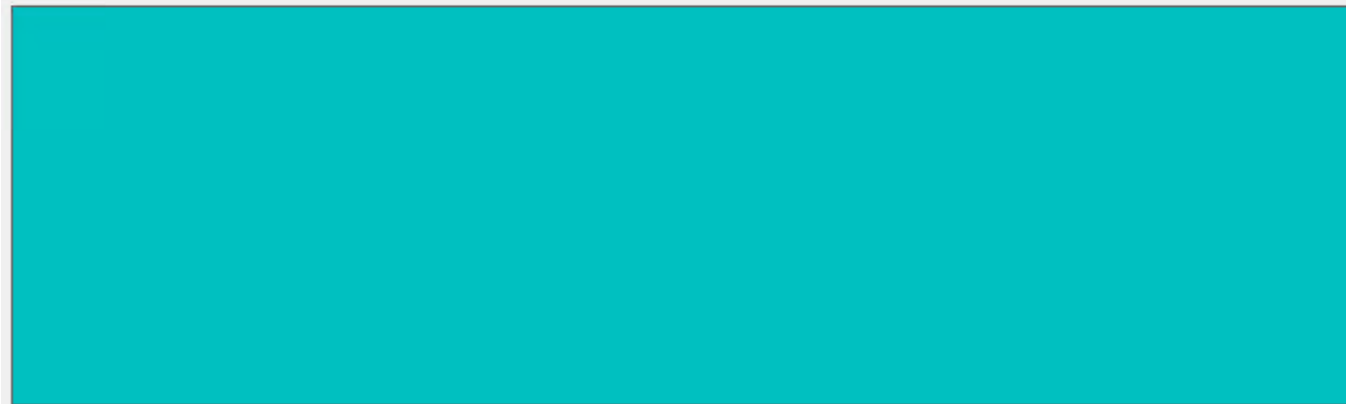

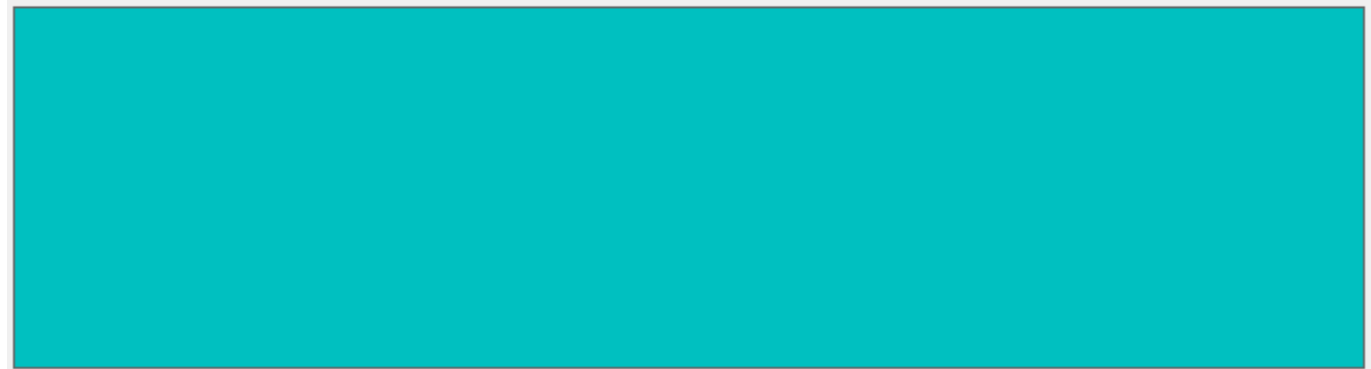

RUNNING TIMES

- Straight Through
- 36 of 48 , 30 of 36, etc.
- Two Day with a night off



BANDS

- All “standard bands” are open for contests – 160m*, 80m, 40m, 20m, 15m, 10m, 6m*
- Meaning non-WARC bands (30m, 17m, 12m) or 60m
- Some contests lop off something, like 6m or 160m
- Special single band contests for 160m, 10m, 6m, or VHF and up



MODES

- Single mode - phone, CW, or digital
- Mixed mode – ARRL Field Day, Winter Field Day



PRECEDENCE

- Field Days differentiate power mode / field
 - Class A - Club / non-club portable
 - Class B – One or two person portable
 - Class F – Emergency Operations Center
- Other contests
 - Single Op, Low Power
 - Single Op, High Power
 - Single Op, Unlimited
 - Multi Op, Single Transmitter
 - Multi, Multi



LOGGING

- Anything you choose, including
 - Paper
 - Your regular permanent log software: Ham Radio Deluxe, ACL, etc.
 - Contest software: N3FJP, N1MM, etc
- Post Contest
 - >> cabrillo format – Universal Log Submission Format (K5LO), “N5KWD.log”
 - >> adif – Amateur Data Interchange Format, “N5KWD.adif”
 - >> Upload: LotW, QRZ, and ClubLog
- Log submission deadlines have tightened drastically (3 to 10 days!!)



GENERAL CONTEST PREPARATION

- Configure radio controls, change from rag chew to contest settings
- Download, *print*, and read contest rules
- Presets for your manual tuner, other presets
- Make 2 gallons of ice tea
- Get a handful of sub sandwiches, microwave breakfast bowls, etc.
- Warn your neighbors



SPECIFIC CONTEST PREPARATION

- Download and install your latest contest software (and test it!)
- Download and print the aids you might want and need for the contest
